As always, our terms seem to fly by - it's hard to believe we're already more than halfway through the term! The 1-3 students have been continuing to learn about persuasive texts and have spent the last two weeks practising writing body paragraphs where they write their arguments. The prep students have been continuing with narrative texts, where they are explaining their likes and dislikes about a text and making a personal connection. Next week they will begin planning their retell of a favourite story. They will need to think about what costumes and props they will need to bring their chosen story to life.

In maths, Prep and Years 2 and 3 students have just completed a number assessment, where there were some very pleasing results. This week prep students move onto learning about the language of direction, while the 2/3s begin work on fractions. The year 1 students are continuing work on two-digit numbers.

We will be entering some artwork and written entries into the Burdekin Festival of the Arts. We followed a drawing tutorial from the website www.artforkidshub.com. Some students were very interested in doing more drawings at home.
